Course Features

- Vocabulary lessons: Approximately 600 high-frequency vocabulary items per level for a total of 1.200+.
- Wide range of topics: Lesson topics include the household and family life, feasts and banquets, nature and pastoral themes, religion and mythology, and going to war, with a focus on the Roman Civil War waged between Julius Caesar and the Roman Senate.
- Paired media: Vocabulary is accompanied by pronunciations, as well as images and annotations that explain both the grammar and historical context behind the chosen words and phrases.
- Skill-building activities: An interactive suite of activities that build listening, speaking, reading, and typing skills as well a scored assessment at the end of each unit.
- Grammar concepts: Each grammar lesson provides a thorough description of the grammar concept being taught, as well as custom grammar drills and activities.

- Logical grammatical sequence: Grammar topics covered include 1st through 3rd declensions, conjugations, prepositions, and plurals in Level I and perfect and imperfect tenses, dative and genitive cases, and irregular verbs in Level II.
- Reading passages: Each unit has its own reading passage that incorporates the vocabulary and grammar topic of the unit. As a bonus, the final review unit contains reading passages adapted from authentic texts of Ovid and Pliny.
- Culture/History supplements: Each unit contains a link to a Transparent Language blog post written to be tied into the theme or the story built into the vocabulary lists, including topics such as slavery, Roman dining practices, important myths, and the Great Roman Civil War at the end of the 1st century BCE.
- Scope and Sequence: A Scope & Sequence is included with the course and lists the units/lessons broken down by topics covered.

Intended Audience

Schools and Educators: Latin teachers can incorporate the course into their curriculum, but districts or universities without a dedicated Latin program can also offer it as an independent learning resource. The Transparent Language Online admin portal allows educators or administrators to make assignments, track and report on student progress, and message with students.

Homeschoolers: Students can learn independently while parents supervise from afar. The course comes with a separate admin account through which parents can track progress, including time spent learning and assessment scores.

Individuals: Any novice-level learner with an interest in Latin can subscribe to the course and learn on their own, although many libraries offer free access to Transparent Language Online already!
